I AM DELIGHTED to introduce you to our 25th edition of Hooked Magazine

2018 season started with the beast from the east only to be followed by the hottest summer on record making fishing unpredictable and difficult at times but some great fishing was still had by our anglers. Season permits are a great way to fish offering 11 months of fishing at all four fisheries, seven days a week, with season catch limits and C&R. Check out this season's prices on page 19. You can even spread the cost over a four staged payment giving you the option to pay your 1st instalment and arrange the following 3 payments monthly or bi-monthly if you sign up by the 31st March 2019.

Many anglers took advantage of the very mild weather around Christmas and New Year to get a few extra hours of fishing in.

Holiday packages have been enjoyed by even more anglers in 2018 allowing you to mix and match your fishing at our four prestigious fisheries all within 40mins drive of each other. Prices are based on two anglers sharing a boat for three consecutive days with the opportunity to extend for that longer break (single man prices also available). Fishing includes a daily 8 fish limit + C&R.

New for this year we are changing our Half Day Four fish permit to now be available all day. This will give you the same four fish limit + C&R across the full day at a price of £25.00.

One of the most enjoyable things for us is the friendly in house matches we hold across our waters. Many of these are ideal for beginners from evening boat leagues, over 50s, pairs, teams of 4, Fur & Feather to Shrimp Masters and much more.

If you are interested in learning to fly fish or going on one of our popular boat handling courses we now have even more days of tuition across our waters. We have a team of instructors led by Peter Hartley who organises these days with 95 day courses and 24 boat handling courses across our waters throughout 2019.

Predator fishing is just as popular as ever with specimen Pike, Perch, and Zander being caught. Don't forget Season permits and Holiday Packages are available for Predator Fishing.

Taverham next to Norwich is our premier coarse fishery with accommodation, tackle shop, carp lakes and a stretch of the river Wensum truly an anglers paradise managed by Harry Wayne-Barker.

Alton Water near Ipswich maintains an option for those wishing to coarse and predator fish near the east coast. Don't forget the brand new campsite which has seen its first successful year of opening, offers a great base so why not bring the family and make a weekend out of it.

STOP THE SPREAD

We are committed to protecting the environment. To keep our waters safe from invasive plants and animals we insist on all anglers following the Check, Clean, Dry Initiative. Non-native species can be spread in any water or material. If you are visiting a water body there is a real risk that you could spread harmful organisms unless you follow good biosecurity practice.

Biosecurity means taking steps to make sure that good hygiene practices are in place to reduce and minimise the risk of spreading invasive non-native species. A good biosecurity routine is essential, even if invasive non-native species are not always apparent. This means you should:

CHECK your equipment and clothing for living plants and animals. Pay particular attention to areas that are damp or hard to inspect.

CLEAN and wash all equipment, footwear and clothes thoroughly. If you do come across any plants or animals, leave them at the water body where you found them.

DRY all equipment and clothing - some species can live for many days in moist conditions. Make sure you don't transfer water elsewhere.

Thank you for helping to keep our fisheries safe from invasive plants and animals.

INVASIVE AQUATIC SPECIES
CHECK-CLEAN-DRY

Are you unknowingly spreading invasive species on your water sports equipment and clothing?
Invasive species can affect fish and other wildlife, restrict navigation, clog up prapellers and be costly to manage. You can help protect the water sports you love by following three simple steps where you leave the water:

- CHECK** Check your equipment and clothing for live organisms - particular in areas that are damp or hard to inspect.
- CLEAN** Clean and wash all equipment, footwear and clothes thoroughly. Use hot water where possible. If you do come across any organisms, leave them at the water body where you found them.
- DRY** Dry all equipment and clothing - some species can live for many days in moist conditions. Make sure you don't transfer water elsewhere.

CATCH & RELEASE

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Catch and release is now a very popular option amongst fly anglers. Here are a few guidelines to ensure the welfare of the fish and the sustainability of catch & release.

Use barbless hooks

Barbless hooks/debarbed must be used at all AW fisheries. Release is much easier, more humane and reduces stress on the fish. If you are de-barbing your own hooks make sure you squash the barb sufficiently flat with a pair of forceps or flat-nose pliers.

Play it quickly

Catch and release is no place for light leaders, if they are required then you should be asking yourself if you should be catching and releasing. By playing a trout to the net as quickly as possible it will conserve energy, recover quickly and be released healthier.

Handling

When fishing from the bank and can easily wade or reach down, you shouldn't need to remove the fish from the water. Retaining the fish in your landing net allows you to remove the hook and rest the fish – ensuring it is recovered and ready to swim away safely. The less the fish is handled the healthier it will be when released. We all know trout fight hard so give them the time to recover they deserve. Under no circumstances should a fish be allowed to 'flap' about on the bank or in the boat.

Catch and release from a boat

The best way to release a fish from a boat is to ensure it does not leave the water. Once the fish is in the landing net keep the net in the water and make sure the fish doesn't bang against the side of the boat. Taking care not to overbalance, release the hook using forceps or a catch and release tool. Once it has sufficiently recovered and you are confident it will swim away strongly gently turn the net and allow the fish to swim away.

Releasing

Good catch and release practice means taking your time. If the fish looks like its struggling, cradle the fish in the water, hold it by the tail and gently move it back and forth until you can feel it gain strength. This may take a few minutes in some circumstances so be patient.

Photographs

If you want a picture of the fish then carefully lift it from the water for just seconds at a time and never more than a couple of feet from the water's surface. Ensure the weight of the fish is supported by both hands and be prepared, have the camera ready to go before lifting the fish from the water.

BEGINNERS FLY FISHING TUITION AND IMPROVERS DAYS 2019

If you want to start fly fishing or are already on your way, our fly fishing courses will help you to get to grips with the basics. The courses are run throughout the year, on weekdays and weekends. Experienced and qualified Angling Trust instructors offer a full day's tuition and cover the skills and tactics which the beginner needs to learn.

All equipment and licences are provided.

If you have your own tackle, please bring it. We can assess its suitability for reservoir fishing.

We will discuss, demonstrate and teach you :-

- Tying knots and leaders
- Casting
- Fly selection and tying
- Tackle selection
- Basic fishing techniques

We will cover all this in the morning and spend the afternoon putting your newly acquired knowledge into practise.

The Cost including refreshments and a light lunch is £88 for an adult, £67 for juniors (14-17).

Find a suitable date and then book a course by calling the fishing lodge. There will be a maximum of six students on any course.

On completing the course you will be entitled to buy a Starter Season Permit – an offer only available to our students.

Boat Handling Courses 2019

If you are unsure about how to work the boat and fishing correctly from the boat, these days will prove invaluable.

An experienced and competent instructor will spend time with you on all aspects of safety, control of the engine, the effect of weather conditions and your own comfort, so that you obtain the most enjoyment from a day in a boat.

The instructor will spend three hours with you and you can then continue fishing for the rest of the day.

Cost is £52 per angler based on two anglers sharing a boat.

KEEPING YOU SAFE

The following guidelines are to help you enjoy your day safely.



ALL ANGLERS

- Always wear head and eye protection when fishing.
- Take your mobile phone with you. The emergency numbers are displayed at the fishing lodge and in the boats.
- Bad weather can prevent you going onto the water, so check the forecast before you leave home. It's particularly relevant if you intend boat fishing alone.
- Sunburn/sun stroke – don't let this happen to you; hat and sun block are essential and plenty of water to drink.
- No fishing in thunderstorms, please lower your rods and put them down.
- Keep cuts and grazes covered and wash your hands before eating.

BANK FISHING

- Our parks are used by many different user groups; a lot will be unaware of the hazards of backcasting. It's your responsibility to make sure that you look behind you and that it is clear when back casting.
- Take care when fishing from the dam walls as they can be slippery.
- Studded boots are advised when fishing on slippery, wet surfaces. Look out for uneven ground, tree roots, algae or debris.
- Do not wade from the dam (No fishing permitted from Pitsford or Alton dams).
- Tread carefully when wading and only wade to thigh depth and be cautious of hazards; particularly soft mud. Consider wearing a lifejacket if wading alone.
- When driving on the access tracks stick to the 10mph speed limit, put on your hazard lights and give way to walkers and cyclists.
- Park in the designated areas for bank anglers.



BOAT FISHING

- Always wear a lifejacket before going onto a pontoon and whilst on the water. If you are unsure how to put your lifejacket on just ask a ranger, who will be happy to help.
- A full induction on the use of a boat can be given by any ranger so please ask if you are unsure of anything.
- Most accidents involving anglers at our reservoirs occur while boarding or disembarking boats. Anglers could take an unwanted dip at this stage. They're so eager to get out there that they grab ALL their gear and jump in the boat as quickly as possible. The result? A rocking boat, unbalanced anglers and the inevitable – an early bath. Carrying lots of tackle puts you off balance. First let your boat partner carefully get in the boat and then hand all your tackle to them. Then step on the centre of the seat when getting in yourself. One other tip – while you are getting in or out, your partner should sit down. If you both become unbalanced, you could both end up in the drink.
- If you are boat fishing on your own please ask a ranger for help with boarding and disembarking your boat. Use your mobile phone to alert the ranger that you are on your way back to the pontoon.
- Always give way to sailors and windsurfers.
- Remain seated (no standing on the seats). Boat seats are a must for comfort - you've a long day ahead. Only approved boat seats are allowed. Thwart boards are provided for a small fee by local clubs, but you will need your own cushion.
- Keep your engine revs down when selecting a gear.
- In rough weather – Do not anchor broadside to the wind.
- Keep the bow of the boat pointing into the wind when under power.
- Boat handling courses are run throughout the year. If you are unsure about how to work the boat and fishing correctly from the boat, these days will prove invaluable. An experienced instructor will spend time with you on all aspects of safety, control of the engine, the effect of weather conditions and your own comfort. The instructor will spend around three hours with you and then you can continue fishing for the rest of the day. The cost is £52 per angler and is based on two anglers sharing a boat. More information and course dates on page 7.

PREDATOR AND COARSE FISHING

RUTLAND, GRAFHAM, PITSFORD WATER & RAVENSTHORPE

These great lakes have proven pedigree for producing record making specimens, with Pike over 40lb, Perch over 5lb and Zander over 19lb.

The great news is that you can fish for these species on a variety of ticket options:

- Day ticket – Anglers can fish any of our waters on a day ticket basis.
- Season ticket - Valid for a year from date of purchase. Holders receive 10% discount off tackle and accessories from our tackle shops.
- Holiday package – Anglers can fish for 3 or more consecutive days and receive a generous discount. Anglers can 'mix and match' venues during their angling holiday

Don't forget all anglers get a bacon sandwich with a tea or filter coffee for just £3.

TAVERHAM MILL

Taverham Mill is a beautiful mixed coarse fishery comprising of 4 lakes and nearly a mile stretch of the river Wensum. The largest lake 'Taverham Mill Lake' is a beautifully mature, heavily tree lined lake of 22 acres. This is predominantly a carp and tench lake with fish up to 35lb in weight. Two further carp syndicate lakes are featured across the nature reserve and these contain specimen carp up to 40lb in weight.

Over the last 3 years the lakes have been stocked regularly with beautiful scaly mirrors and commons from VS Fisheries, Priory Fisheries and Dinton Fisheries. Anglian Water will continue a comprehensive 5 year stocking programme across the lakes introducing young fish every year.



WHERE YOU CAN FISH:

Taverham Mill Lake

Taverham Mill Lake boasts carp to 35lb and Tench to 9lb amongst other species, including Roach, Perch, Pike and a few Eels that are rare visitors to the bank. The recently installed otter fence is proving effective in keeping the Taverham Mill Lake fish safe from predation. All of the lakes are now fully fenced to protect the incredible stocks for the future.

With every feature imaginable including; lily beds, weed, gravel bars and overhanging margins, it is the perfect challenge for coarse anglers. Simple tactics work including small solid pva bags, chod rigs and other pop up presentations. As the Mills Lake is so irregular in shape, location is key and advice is always on hand in the on-site visitor centre for the latest information.

Costessey No.1 Lake (day ticket water)

Open for the 2019/20 season is our day ticket lake and this offers some excellent mixed coarse fishing from easy access swims and ample secure car parking. The lake is predominantly a water for families and junior anglers to learn how to coarse fish in the traditional way, on the float and feeder. Costessey No.1 lake is also home to some large pike up to 20lb+.

Costessey (Ski Pit) & Costessey No.3 Lake

The Costessey Ski Pit and Costessey No.3 Lake are both mature gravel pits stocked with specimen carp up to 40lb in weight. The fishing is challenging with plenty of features, spacious swims and small syndicate membership. Both lakes are fully otter fenced and members have a combination code to the car parks at each end of the lakes.

These famous old waters are home to a stunning stock of mixed strained mirrors and commons from VS Fisheries, Dinton Pastures and our very own Anglian Water lagoons.

At the fishery there is a newly renovated self-catering accommodation block that sleeps up to 8 people with double and twin bedrooms. Staying in the accommodation allows guests free fishing on Taverham Mill Lake and the river Wensum. The on-site tackle shop is stocked with everything you will need to approach the fishing on the lakes and river including brands such as Korda, Trakker, Nash, Fox, CC Moore and Sticky Baits. Advice is always on hand from the staff and water bailiffs to help in any way we can.

Alton Water

Alton Water is the largest Suffolk inland water nestled amongst over 400 acres of beautiful countryside. The reservoir is just over 300 acres and has been a fantastic mixed coarse fishery since the 1980s.

Alton Water offers the coarse angler a wide variety of opportunity; from quality roach and bream fishing, specimen pike fishing during the colder months and for those in search of some nomadic and unchartered angling, there are some stunning mixed strain carp. There is also the potential of some larger, older fish amongst the existing carp stock.

Over recent years the angling has improved immensely, with some excellent numbers of people fishing the prestigious 'Alton Open Match'. Good bags of quality sized bream and roach are caught daily over the best months of the season. In particular, the roach numbers have been a highlight of the last few seasons with some fantastic catches becoming more of the norm.

With a forward thinking stocking plan in partnership with the Environment Agency there is a bright future for the water. The well known V S Fisheries have stocked the reservoir with some stunning mirrors and commons over the last couple of years and this is set to continue year on year. There have been some notable catches of carp caught in the autumn of 2018, particularly by one young angler 'James Wintrip' who had the determination and desire to explore the unknown. This resulted in a 7 fish tally with some of the recently stocked carp to over 20lb+. Imagine some of these in the next couple of years!

If you enjoy some stunning vistas and angling on a larger scale, Alton Water is a beautiful setting to enjoy some varied fishing. All forms of the pursuit can be explored on the reservoir and it is this traditional outlook on coarse fishing, in all of its forms, that makes this historic venue stand out.




